In addition to training for the membership drive, we are going to cover the following important topics at this meeting:

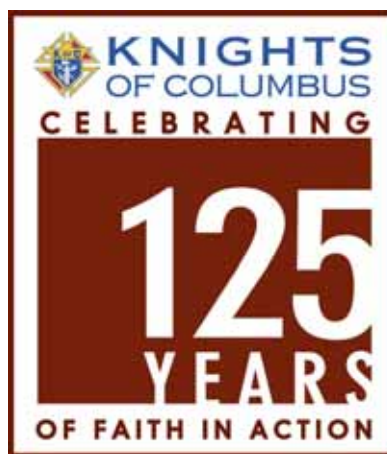
- The proposed budget for the new Columbian year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>.

### AN EDITORIAL COMMENT

This past Sunday, after getting home from the Jubilee Retreat at St. Clare's I was looking at the Sunday Tri-Valley Herald, and as usual turned to the Editorial Page. I could not believe my eyes! The Editor, Tom Tuttle, was actually disappointed in the results of the Supreme Court's finding that the ban on Partial Birth Abortion should be upheld. His position as stated in his own words, puts him squarely in the camp of the Culture of Death.

After several intense discussions during the retreat centered on exactly that subject, and on the urging of the Holy Spirit, I decided I should do something about this outrage. I felt that the only right thing to do would be to cancel my subscription to the Herald. I've been a subscriber to that paper since returning to Livermore in 1991. And before that my parents always had a subscription to the Herald since 1963. In fact, my mother worked for the paper for 27 years in the Classified department as head bookkeeper. Back when it was a family owned paper, owned by the Sparks

family, the paper was editorially aligned with traditional family values. Since Mr. Sparks retirement and sale of the paper to the Alameda Newspaper Group, however, the paper has become more aligned with the liberal papers over on the other side of the Dublin Grade, The San Francisco Chronicle or the New York Times .

Anyway, one part of Tuttle's editorial I most strongly object to is his assertion that "there are many legitimate circumstances that warrant abortions, such as rape, birth defects and danger to a woman's health." There can **never** be any reason for an abortion—it is the tradition of the legal system in this country that the law prevents visiting punishment on the children for the sins of the parents, which is what aborting the child produced from rape or incest is. And cures or effective treatments are always being developed for dealing with birth defects—the announcement of a drug to specifically deal with diseases caused by so-called "nonsense" mutations, and other research into curing diseases such as Down's Syndrome, make the birth defect argument equally wrong-headed. And it has been proven that the only danger to a woman's health that is used to justify abortions is to her lifestyle—a baby becomes an "inconvenience".

Tuttle also ties a mythical failure of abstinence training to a rise in "unwanted" pregnancies. His choice of terminology in the editorial, such as referring to the "right" to an abortion as "choice" and to the pro-life activists as being "anti-choice" clearly brand Tuttle, and by extension, the entire Tri-Valley Herald, as slanted with a decidedly liberal bias. If he had been writing about any other of the liberal media's pet subjects such as illegal immigrant reform, global warming, or other subjects, I probably would not have gotten so outraged. After all, the editor is entitled to his opinion on those subjects. But explicitly supporting the Culture of Death, well, I cannot sit by on this one.

So I called the customer service number, and after getting through the menu system was talking to a nice lady who asked me how she could help me. I got straight to the point—"I am canceling my subscription to the Herald." She asked for identifying information which I provided. She then asked me why I wanted to cancel. I again went straight to the point: "Because I can not in good conscience do business with an organization that blatantly supports the Cul-

ture of Death. The editorial in Sunday's Herald shows clearly that the editors, and by extension, the entire paper, views abortion as a 'right' and that you all are disappointed that the Supreme Court upheld the ban on Partial Birth Abortions." I told her goodbye, and proceeded to write a letter to the editor of the Herald, reiterating my statements and further indicating that I would be telling everyone I know and am in contact with that if they have a Herald subscription to cancel it and why.

So I am doing this through this editorial comment, and through the email I sent to our Yahoo! Groups email distribution list, and personal face-to-face contact, and I am urging you, my brothers, to put your money where your mouth is, and read the editorial if you haven't, and pray about it, and follow the teachings of the church along with the help of the Holy Spirit, and do the right thing.

And the money I was spending on my subscription to the Herald will now be donated to BirthRight, and I will get my news online, from such places as LifeNews.com, National Right to Life Council (NRLC.org), Fox News, The Catholic News Service, EWTN, and the like.

I think I will also examine the position of the other networks as it relates to the abortion issue, and the position of the sponsors of the network's TV shows, and let any of them, that support the Culture of Death, know that I will no longer give any of my hard earned pay to support them.

I may very well end up watching **no** network TV, but I **will** live up to the principles of the Church and the Knights of Columbus.

And I will continue to communicate to all within my reach why we need to fight against the Culture of Death. (See Matthew 25:40)

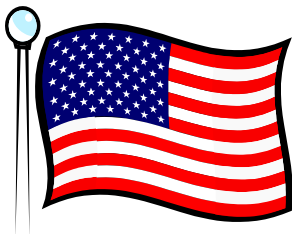
